Self efficacy is commonly defined as the belief in one's capabilities to achieve a goal or an outcome. Students with a strong sense of efficacy are more likely to challenge themselves with difficult tasks and be intrinsically motivated.

Students' attitudes influence their communication with patients, while their self-efficacy describes their judgment of their ability to deal with different doctor—patient communication situations in terms of what to do, investment of effort, persistence, and level of anxiety.

Less than half (44.8%) of students strongly agree/agree that PWD perform as well as people without disabilities. Two significant factors that serve in understanding if students accept m-learning technology are self- efficacy and attitudes towards m-learning usage. For this purpose, the present study investigated vocational college students' self-efficacy and attitudes towards the use of m-learning.

Investigating Students' Self-Efficacy and Attitudes ...

Self-efficacy is a key concept for ensuring student participation and encouraging learning (Graham, Harris, Bartlett, Popadopoulou & Santoro, 2014). Jinks and Lorsbach (2003) argue that self-efficacy may be a powerful tool for educators to meet the learning needs of students.

Also, in Lent, Larkin and Brown's research (1986), they also supported that academic self-efficacy was a reliable predictor of one's educational performance (p. 265).

A Study of the Attitude, Self-efficacy, Effort and ...

The result in Table 1 on students' computer self efficacy and attitude towards internet shows that the calculated r-value is indicating that there is a positive and significant relationship between students' computer self-efficacy and their attitudes towards the internet. This observed positive relationship implies that as students computer self efficacy increases, their attitude towards internet also increases.

Teachers' professional self-efficacy is considered an important variable in inclusive education (Sarı, Çeliköz, & Seçer, 2009), because teachers' beliefs can influence their teaching effectiveness, even for students who are difficult or lack motivation (Guskey & Passaro, 1994).

The authors' hypothesis was two-fold: self-efficacy and coping styles are largely related; and self-efficacy is a predictor of student retention. Participants included 131 first-year undergraduate sports degree students. Open-ended questionnaires were used to create a 40-item self-efficacy measure to gauge confidence levels.

Students were given 50 minutes in class to complete a paper-pencil questionnaire consisting of a background section, a financial knowledge test, and a survey designed to assess attitudes towards money, financial self-efficacy, self-reported financial behavior, financial experiences, and financial socialization issues.

The results demonstrate that the student self-efficacy, knowledge retention, and engagement will improve.
