A phrasal verb is a combination of a verb and preposition that has a different meaning than the words individually. For example, "going out" has a different meaning than "going" and "out" do by themselves. Because of this, teaching phrasal verbs can be tricky for grammar or English teachers, especially those with ESL students.
