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Formal Communication Channels Upward Downward

Horizontal Communication Upward and downward communication flows generally follow the formal hierarchy within the school organization. However, greater size and complexity of organizations increase the need for communication laterally or diagonally across the lines of the formal chain of command. This is referred to as horizontal communication.

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The upward communication can also be called the bottom-up communication.
