Understanding Dental Anesthesia: Types, Side Effects & Risks

Inhalant general anesthetics are the anesthetics of choice in many small animal patients, especially for procedures lasting longer than 10-15 min. The inhalants isoflurane and sevoflurane offer the advantage for outpatient anesthesia of rapid adjustment of inhaled and alveolar anesthetic dose and effect.

The Council considers that general anaesthesia, a procedure which is never without risk, should be avoided in the practice of dentistry if at all possible. Patients seeking general anaesthesia, where it is not clinically appropriate, should be advised of and encouraged to accept alternative methods of anxiety control.
