Usually, using a 16-gauge wire is recommended for most home theater applications. However, if the wiring network for your home theater requires more than 50 feet of wire or if you want to set up in-wall or ceiling speakers, you may need to use a thicker wire (preferably 14 or 12-gauge) because long cable runs can cause considerable power losses.

6 Must-See Tips to Manage Wiring for Your Home Theater Setup

One mistake a lot of people make here is purchasing an HDMI cable that is too short. I would recommend a 6' or 8' HDMI cable when hooking up any TV over 46", assuming your gear is located just below. The common lengths of 2' to 4' are best suited for connecting your source equipment to the receiver. Receiver - You can plug your sources (Wii, Blu-ray, Satellite/Cable set-top box) into the HDMI and Component inputs on the receiver.

Some HDMI cables that are rated for in-wall use don't support 4K or HDR video. Fortunately there are some clever solutions, such as baluns, that use in-wall-rated network cable, coax cable (RG-6), or even fiber optic cable to pass audio and video signals over long distances.

Plug one end of an HDMI cable into the back of your video component (e.g., a Blu-Ray player), then plug the other end of the cable into an "HDMI In" port on the back of the receiver. Virtually all modern video components will connect to your receiver via an HDMI cable.
