In amateur radio, the Q-codes were originally used in Morse code transmissions to shorten lengthy phrases and were followed by a Morse code question mark (··— —··) if the phrase was a question. Q-codes are commonly used in voice communications as shorthand nouns, verbs, and adjectives making up phrases.

Morse code consists of dits and dahs — NOT dots and dashes, the code sounds like “dit-dah” when it’s sent, so, Morse operators don’t talk about dot and dash, rather, we say “dit” and “dah.” With a straight key, the operator forms the characters by holding the key down for a short time — dit — or a longer time — dah.

While voice and data transmissions are limited to specific amateur radio bands under U.S. rules, Morse code is permitted on all amateur bands—LF, MF, HF, VHF, and UHF. In some countries, certain portions of the amateur radio bands are reserved for transmission of Morse code signals only.
