If your company filed a retrospective activity notice (Notice of Activity Form A) under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) Inventory Notification (Active-Inactive) Rule and claimed the specific chemical identity as confidential business information (CBI), you have until November 1, 2020, to submit or amend your CBI substantiations.
