Paediatric Scenarios COMMON CHILDHOOD PROBLEMS

The paediatric pharmacists were asked to simulate 49 erroneous prescribing scenarios (see online supplementary data) based on the previously published indicators. 19 The indicators described prescribing scenarios which by consensus would cause harm if they reached the patient.

Electronic prescribing in paediatric secondary care: are ...

Generally, non-adherence to organisational rules—for example, failure to adhere to hospital, national and paediatric guidelines, not including dosage equations in the prescription, use of unlicensed and off-label drugs, and prescribing by brand name— was not considered to be a prescribing error.

What constitutes a prescribing error in paediatrics? | BMJ ...

The aim was to assess the level of understanding that paediatric doctors have about prescribing the correct doses of medications for obese children. This requires doctors to be aware that in obese children certain medications cannot be calculated using TBW and they must have knowledge about the methods used to calculate the IBW.

Prescribing in obese children: how good are paediatricians ...

Our paediatric intensive care unit (PICU) performs active surveillance for prescribing errors and detects a mean of 1.66 with an SD of 0.18 total prescription errors per occupied bed day. The primary aim of this project was to reduce the number of prescribing errors in PICU.

Paediatric SCRIPT is an eLearning programme, which aims to improve prescribing competency and safety among specialist paediatric trainees. It is now being used by all Paediatric Schools in England. Launched in 2016, Paediatric SCRIPT was created by a group of paediatric trainees who had used SCRIPT during their Foundation training and felt a similar resource was required for paediatric prescribing, as studies showed that the incidence of prescribing errors in paediatric in-patients is around ...

Miscalculation, misplacement of decimal points or confusion around the ‘mg/kg/day’ dosing equations that are common in paediatrics were a major cause of errors. 38 Four studies assessed doctors' ability to perform calculations in written tests. 39–42 Presented with common prescribing scenarios, junior doctors frequently made errors; in one study, for example, seven of 21 prescribers made tenfold dosing errors. 40 Research showing that computer-calculated doses were significantly more ...

Consensus was reached to define as errors all reported smart-pump scenarios (n = 6) and those pertaining to the pre-electronic process of prescribing weight-based paediatric infusions (n = 4). Of 7 electronic-prescribing scenarios, 4 were defined as errors, 2 were deemed not to be and consensus could not be achieved for the last.

Defining electronic-prescribing and infusion-related ...

The extent of their agreement on a definition of a prescribing error, and on 40 scenarios that might be classified as prescribing errors in paediatric practice, was obtained. Results: Response rates were 84% (n=42) in the first Delphi round and 95% (n=40) in the second. Consensus was to accept the general definition of a prescribing error.
