When samples aren't randomly selected, the data usually has some form of bias, so using data that wasn't randomly selected to make inferences about its population can be risky. Inference Procedure Summary - AP Statistics Two Sample Means and Proportions CI for mean  $\mu_1 - \mu_2$  when  $\sigma$  is unknown  $\frac{s_1}{\sqrt{n_1}} - \frac{s_2}{\sqrt{n_2}} \pm t^* \sqrt{\frac{s_1^2}{n_1} + \frac{s_2^2}{n_2}}$  with conservative  $df = n_1 - 1$  of smaller sample 1. Populations are independent 2.

### Inference Procedure Summary - AP Statistics

The observed difference in sample proportions =  $\hat{p}_1 - \hat{p}_2 = 0.587 - 0.650 = -0.063$ , so the 95% confidence interval is  $-0.063 \pm 0.1029$ , or -16.6% to 4.0%. We are 95% confident that the proportion of women who exercise regularly is between 4.0% lower and 16.6% higher than the proportion of men who exercise regularly.
