Harry Stack Sullivan, the pioneer of interpersonal psychoanalysis, defined sublimation as the unwitting substitution of a partial satisfaction with social approval for the pursuit of a direct satisfaction which would be contrary to one's ideals or to the judgment of social censors and other important people who surround one. The substitution might not be quite what we want, but it is the only way that we can get part of our satisfaction and feel secure, too.

In his short glossary of Freudian ideas and concepts Nick Rennison defines sublimation in this way: Sublimation—the unconscious mental process by which in- stinctual, socially unacceptable energy or libido is transferred to a non-instinctual, socially acceptable activity, e.g., Freud be- lieved that the sublimation of unsatisfied libido was behind the creation of great art and literature.1
